SPECIAL NOTE TO EAGLE BOARD OF REVIEW MEMBERS. - THERE IS NO CURRENT WRITTEN RULE THAT REQUIRES A MINIMUM OF 100 HOURS.

Note: Clothing drives, donation drives, and blood drives, collections are worthy service projects, but you have to be careful to plan them to meet the expectations for an Eagle Scout Leadership Service project. Remember, your goal is to lead others as well as provide some service to the community. You will want to do a project that requires a number of volunteers who will carry out the project under your leadership. The problem is easiest to describe with blood drives. As one Scouter said, "my secretary can organize a blood drive in 5 minutes - call the blood bank, arrange a date, and they'll provide posters and show up with a crew. How does that show leadership?" Good question, and not one you want to try to justify in front of your board of review. To make this type of project work , set an ambitious goal, above and beyond the typical drive. For example, organize a project to collect 100 units of blood. That's 2-3 times more than might usually be collected. You'll need volunteers to help promoting the project, processing the crowds, etc. You may have to coordinate more than one blood collecting crew have radio and TV coverage. You get the idea - if you do an ordinary, easy collecting drive of some sort, you are certainly providing a service, but can you explain to your board of review how you demonstrated Eagle-quality leadership? Also remember you should also be able to show a large amount of hours. Please note that some colleges are now asking for a copy of your final Eagle Project or a single one page description of your project. I recommend that you send a synopsis of your Eagle Project with your college application. Try to make the project meaningful and equal to your talents as a scout.

EAGLE PROJECTS BONE MARROW/BLOOD DRIVE RED CROSS

1	Increased the area and increased the number of blood donors. He arranged for new blood drives in parts of the county and passed out fliers to get new donors in new areas of the county.
2	Blood drive which coincided with September 11 and also did a food drive
3	Trained people in the Community in First Aid and CPR.
4	Set up blood drive and collected over 30 pints of blood
5	Blood Drive in town (Small town of less than 2000)
6	The scout organized an Emergency Preparedness Fair where different groups presented information on: food storage recipe ideas and demonstrations on how to cook with food storage items 72-hour emergency kits, emergency kits for automobiles water storage what to do in case of natural disasters and other emergencies. He also took orders and provided at cost one hundred and ten 72-hour Emergency Food Kits, sealed in Mylar bags. The Emergency Preparedness Fair was a great success
7	A Blood Drive with NY/SI Blood Bank

8	Supervised and conducted a blood drive.
9	I built a brochure holder for the local Red Cross. It was like what you see at restaurants. It allowed the Red Cross to put their pamphlets in something other than scattered on a table. The stand had a storage area underneath that let them store extras
10	A Smart/911 light bulb was distributed. The bulb has a computer chip inside. It is used in the outside light holder. If the switch is flipped once, it is a regular bulb, but if flipped twice, it blinks so the EMS, Police, etc. find the house quickly.
11	I had a bake & yard sale, solicited local businesses for donations. I installed smoke detectors, carbon monoxide detectors, and fire extinguishers. in elderly, needy, and foster homes picked by social services & the Fire Marshall. This project was a HUGE success. 363 hours
12	Worked with 911 center to find a place on their computer to enter special info for the address, such as disabled person, blind, etc. Created and distributed forms throughout the county. Used local home nursing agencies, red cross, meals on wheels, etc

13	Built new disaster room for Red Cross by making 300 hygiene kits and made available supplies such as cups, coffee pots, beverage carriers and food transporters. (Note: Thirty days after completion, a disaster forced 365 families out of their homes and all went well because of the preparations.)
14	Organized blood drive for blood bank.

EAGLE PROJECTS COLLECTIONS

15	Collection of goods for an organization for troubled teens.
16	Scout collected books from the community for an underprivileged library . He focused on children's books for their reading program, and was able to deliver over 17,000 books.
17	Scout's Eagle service project was a very successful collection of shoes and socks to benefit the homeless. Over 1,000 pairs of shoes were collected and donated to the Center which helps the homeless people in our area improve their situation.
18	Scout collected articles for a Auction and garage sale to raise money for Interfaith Care gives a program to help pay for transportation for persons of critical care to appointments and treatments, were there is no other way of getting there.
19	Scout collected enough personal hygiene articles to put together over 75 personal hygienic kits which were donated to a Rescue Mission.
20	I made the effort to include the citizens in my community help with the creation of personnel hygiene kits for the homeless men and women in my city
21	Gathered clothing and cash donations of over \$20,000 for needy young people.

22	Clothing drive for Bosnian Refugees
23	A collection of wish list items for a Women's Shelter for victims of domestic abuse.
24	Supervised the collection of food and drink for the 9/11 disaster
25	Suitcases for kids. Filled tote bags with a book, toothbrush, toothpaste, and small toy for children in foster care
26 27	Organized troop and collected food, towels and toiletries for the rescue mission
28	Planned and executed toy drive for distributing toys to benefit children of 9/11
29	collected clothing, blankets, food for the local help center
30	Build, stock and provide mobile First Aid Kits to the local Chapter of the Youth Soccer League.
31	Collected baby items for Charities 2224 items.
32	Collected 1/2 ton of food for local pantries.
33	Collected, Sorted and Delivered donated coats to Charity.
34	Plan, coordinate, organize, publicize and implement a project to collect toys for the USMC "toys for tots" program
35	Collected eyeglasses for Lions club for distribution to the needy.

36	Collected baby clothes and supplies, for Mommas House which helps unmarried women and pregnant women with he care of their children
37	Collected materials needed by local Fire Department during search and rescue months at WTC after 9/11. Also collected \$2000.00 for Widow's Fund.
38	Collected eyeglasses and sunglasses in conjunction with the Lion's Club. These glasses will be distributed to the poor and the needy of underdeveloped countries.
39	Collected about \$3000 to set up a learning center
40	He gathered, sorted and cleaned clothes so that the town could have a clothing shelter for the homeless. He also helped opened the used clothing store.
41	Collected over 2 tons of clothing for the needy
42	Conducted a cross country race that collected over 500 items of food for the needy of the community.
43	Food drive for Community Food Pantry
44	Clothing Drive for needy and homeless.
45	Eye Glasses collection and recycling.
46	The scout was able to donate over 1,000 personal care items/toiletries for the persons at a domestic abuse center

47	Planned, coordinated, recruited volunteers and supervised a food drive and food packing for, a food pantry which provides temporary assistance for area needy. He also collected money which he used for the purchase of gift certificates for meat which were also distributed to the families.
48	Canned food drive to help flood victims in 1993
49	After his Father died of Leukemia, he organized a Bone Marrow/Blood Drive. He collected over 70 pints of Blood at the donor/blood drive. He wrote and received a grant to pay the cost of the test to get the donors typed and cross matched
50	Took place over 3 weekends. First, passed out flyers to 4 subdivisions announcing book collection. Second weekend, returned to the houses and picked up books. Third, set up library in local Ruth's House for battered women and children
51	Committed and received 400 pairs of new winter hats and gloves for needy children. Also had sweatshirts, sweat pants, and other clothing [all new] donated. I was able to help throw a 'harvest party' for over 200 kids and handed out goodie bags (candy, too)
52	My Eagle project was to collect clothes and donate them to the Salvation Army to give to the poor and homeless. To my surprise, the out come was more than a van full, they had to make a second trip to collect all the donated clothes

53	Compiled a list of organizations that would provide help to citizens in our suburb. Wrote each group for their approval to be included in the book. Compiled and published the 44 page book. Distributed the books to all medical facilities, libraries, etc
54	I organized donations and made 100 personal hygiene kits for our local homeless shelter. The kits were valued over \$1000. They contained, shampoo, a comb, soap, lotion, toothbrush, toothpaste, and a razor
55	I held a food drive on two consecutive days at a San Jose sharks game. My goal was to bring in 1,000 pounds of food but I was able to bring in over 14,000 pounds
56	I organized and ran the Scouting for Food Drive in my Local area after the councils involvement disappeared.
57	A battered woman's shelter in town was in great need of cloths and toys for the women and kids staying there. Over 5 weeks a drive was held at local stores in town and a radio ad went on during the drive. More than 4,000 items were collected and \$500+
58	For my Eagle Project I collected some 1,572 pairs of used prescription eyeglasses for distribution to the poor and needy in third world countries. This project is sponsored by LensCrafters and the Lions' Club International

<p>59</p>	<p>I collected new and used hearing aids from dealers, mortuaries, golf courses, etc. The scouts cleaned, tested, and mailed them to a company that donates them to poor people in third world countries. Medical personal donated their time to travel to the company</p>
<p>60</p>	<p>I had a bake & yard sale, solicited local businesses for donations. I installed smoke detectors, carbon monoxide detectors, and fire extinguishers. in elderly, needy, and foster homes picked by social services & the Fire Marshall. This project was a HUGE success. 363 hours</p>
<p>61</p>	<p>Well, I raised over \$2,100 through dinners, car washes, bake sales, etc. I then donated all this money to the Crossroads Drug Rehabilitation Center. This center was started by Eric Clapton. Troop 221 LI, NY. - Eric</p>
<p>62</p>	<p>My Eagle project was a clothing drive by which over 7,500 pieces of winter clothing and blankets were collected, sorted, and donated to various homeless services in the Seattle area</p>

<p>63</p>	<p>Auction - For a new Public City Pool My project took about 4 mo. I sent fliers in to the community and collected donations, and items to sell. I even got a car donated from the city I lived in. Besides collecting items, businesses came forward and donated over \$2000.00 in cash. 3 mo later I held a city wide auction. the auction company even donated there time into the project. I raised over \$6000.00 for the project, and donated it all to the construction of a new public pool.</p>
<p>64</p>	<p>Gather fabric, batting and matching thread. Have the scouts trace a scarf pattern, and cut it out. Get sewing businesses and adults to help sew these up. Donate them to the American Cancer Society for the chemotherapy patients to use. It will help these patients keep their spirits up during and after treatments</p>
<p>65</p>	<p>40 First Aid kits for Area Youth Sports teams in my area were built from scratch. There were donations from area businesses, and I had stickers made with the name of their company on them.</p>
<p>66</p>	<p>For my project I assembled over 200 care packages for the troops in Iraq, consisting of necessities and essentials like: soap, shampoo, body lotion, food, etc.</p>

67	Boy Scout Memorabilia Exhibit We collected memorabilia as far back as 1918. We received a WWI Savings Bond Medal and, merit badges, pictures and a Journal from the 1929 World Jamboree in England (in which the Prince of Wales made Baden-Powell, Lord Baden-Powell).
68	Developed clothing, food and toy giveaway for Christmas. Distributed food to 641 families, toys to 441 families and clothing to 395 families in county.
69	Developed Clothes Away by collecting and sorting 5,000 pounds of clothing and giving it away to 300 families at National Guard Armory.
70	Collected and sorted clothing and sports equipment for juvenile detention center. Also made Easter baskets for juveniles
71	Collected 1,200 books and periodicals and established library at care center.
72	Collected books for center attempting to improve child and adult literacy among residents of city housing projects.
73	Donated 72 blankets to national support group for Vietnam veterans.
74	I heard about the eyeglass drive, where Scouts collect eyeglasses from local mortuaries, and send them to third world countries. I decided to try it with hearing aids. I worked with an audiologist (my Dad) to get the project going.

75	I collected eyeglasses from local mortuaries for three months, and then sent them with a doctor who goes to Mexico. He gave them to people who could not afford to buy glasses for themselves.
76	For Christmas, I organized a toy drive with a thrift store in town. All the toys were donated to foster homes and orphanages.
77	Putt together a door-to-door clothing drive

EAGLE PROJECTS FIRE - AMBULANCE DEPARTMENTS

78	Paint white rings on telephone poles near fire hydrants, so that the hydrants can be seen in adverse weather by the Firemen
79	The Fire Department has a museum, and it was in disrepair. The Scout repaired and painted it.
80	The Scouts project was quite unique and very timely. After 9-11, and watching a special on making your neighborhood safe, he planned and executed a project that would not only provide security but awareness for all our neighbors. His project consisted of two distinct parts. The first was the painting of house numbers on the curbs on over 100 houses in his subdivision to aid emergency response personnel in their efforts to find homes in an emergency. The second part consisted of an education campaign where he distributed fire and crime prevention information to all the neighborhood homeowners.
81	Painted yellow glow markings on telephone poles near fire hydrant, so that the hydrants could be more easily found.

82	I cleaned & painted fire hydrants for the Hastings Utilities Water Dept. in Hastings, NE. I painted the barrels silver then painted the bonnets and hose caps either red, orange or green to comply with the AWWA standards for gallons per minute of flow.
83	Inspected, Scraped old paint, cut weeds back from around fire hydrants, and painted fire hydrants
84	This project includes the distribution of medicine vials and information sheet to provide emergency personnel with vital medical information
85	Paint house numbers on the curb for each house in a 700 home development
86	Painting the inside walls of a fire house

EAGLE PROJECTS PAINTING-REPAINTING PROJECTS

87	Repainting the parking lot at The Temple of Avhat Shalom.
88	Painting of classrooms.
89	Project he fixed up a playground by doing maintenance work and painting.
90	Scout repainted a Sherman tank that sits in front of AMVETS that has been a real eye sore for our community.
91	Painting over graffiti in five different community locations.
92	Major sign painting project for the Historical Museum.
93	Painting curbs for traffic and handicapped entrances.
94	renovation of downtown railway station, circa 1950's. . they replaced old wood, and repainted this was part of a downtown restoration project
95	Painted the Alzheimer's Foundation office and reception area.
96	Repainted Town's Gazebo

97	Fixed barn for Community Farm. Repaired half of roof, installed door and repainted barn.
98	Repair and clean up of the Community House. Painted several rooms, changed out all the light bulbs in the house, trimmed the trees, and cleaned the gutters of the house.
99	Repair and painting with preservative of 1/3 mile of split rail fencing for Golf Course (public course)
100	Paint exterior parking lot with yellow parking space lines, curbs red for fire zones, handicap parking
101	Lead a project to paint the basement kitchen/eating area of the Grange and to do minor repair/improvements to the basement kitchen/eating area
10	Restored a community recreation area on post. Project involved cleaning, painting, and replacement of safety fence.
103	Organized the exterior restoration of a small 100 + year old chapel on the property of our sponsoring organization. The Scouts scraped, primed and painted the building
104	Built shelves and painted a garage at a Youth Home

105	I employed 1000+ man hours executing this project. It consisted of a 9' tall by 30' long by 15' wide patio cover. 6.5'x 18" cement footing. 10 gallons of paint, and other materials totaling \$3,000, all money and food was donated
106	I added handicap spaces and painted the parking lots
107	I cleaned and repainted black top and repainted the lines and created handicapped spaces.
108	I had rotten boards replaced and all boards primed and painted on four sets of softball bleachers at a local field. The metal bleacher supports were all painted with Silverbrite. The four dug out benches were also included.
109	I added handicap spaces and painted the parking lots in the Parroquia Corazon De Maria. I became an Eagle Scout in the Troop 68 of Puerto Rico
110	I and several scouts painted our Community Gym. It took us 7 hours to paint and to clean-up
111	I painted the neighborhood Y.M.C.A. Every time we drive by it, my Dad slows down to admire the "professional paint job". It was a lot of hard work. I live in Dallas, TX by the way.

112	I renovated a portable building we created a meeting room, removed plumbing, called for estimates on electric, air and plumbing. The place was repainted and carpeted .all donated. I raised donations to feed my crew. I gave back to my community.
113	Brad and the boys of Troop 607 sanded down and repainted 6 large picnic tables
114	I sanded, and applied stain to the baseball field bleachers in Turbotville, PA. I also painted the dugouts, and touched up the bleacher bases
115	One Eagle repainted a torpedo and a deck gun at the Battleship Texas site in Houston. That involved a lot of sanding and repair as well as all the painting. It took two days.

EAGLE PROJECTS PUBLIC EDUCATION

116	Painting seat belt safety messages on entrance and exit driveways of local businesses to spread seat belt awareness.
117	The project participants went to the homes of several elderly citizens and marked their personal property with their individual identification number. This will aid in recovery if the property is stolen or destroyed. He also provided the occupant with a record of marked property to be maintained by the home owner.
118	Cleaning, Painting and stenciling "No Dumping Flows to the Bay" on 54 Storm drains in the scouts city
119	Ran a fingerprint and photograph ID project at Developmental Disabilities Institute. He worked with children with various disabilities.
120	Bicycle safety program, anti-theft registration, and fund raiser for Christopher Reeve Paralysis Foundation, with Police Precinct and AAA.
121	Make a pamphlet to educate people as to what to do for safety before, during and after a Nor'easter or similar storm.

<p>122</p>	<p>Petting zoo for county. 700+ hours by 20 youth and adults. Informed community about responsible animal ownership. Animals included emus, peacocks, ducks, geese, pot belly pigs, sheep, goats, llamas, donkeys, and chickens to name a few. The scouts made posters, tamed the animals, birthed, and worked with the local humane society</p>
<p>123</p>	<p>Held a mercury fever thermometer exchange. He received 56 mercury thermometers from people and gave each person a digital thermometer to replace it. The mercury thermometers were taken to a site which safely disposes of them.</p>
<p>124</p>	<p>Painted "Dump No Waste, Drains To Stream" using stencils at 300 Catch Basins</p>
<p>125</p>	<p>Three part program included: 1)speakers to promote wearing bike helmets, 2)art contest with safety as the theme, and 3)A bicycle rodeo, with a bicycle safety check & a series of courses to let participants test their bike savvy & skill</p>
<p>126</p>	<p>Our sponsoring organization wanted to do a Bike Safety Rodeo to show younger kids how to care for and ride their bikes safely. I organized safety videos, a local bike shop to do minor repairs, and an obstacle course to demonstrate proper riding technique</p>

127	I organized a bike registration for local neighborhoods and the police department. I also performed safety inspections on the bikes we registered
128	Compiled a list of organizations that would provide help to citizens in our suburb. Wrote each group for their approval to be included in the book. Compiled and published the 44 page book. Distributed the books to all medical facilities, libraries, etc
129	Fingerprinted children and adults in the community at a city home days celebration during the summer. 500 People were fingerprinted
130	I went around the City and tested the smoke detectors of the residents of the city if they did not have a working smoke detector then I installed one for them
131	Using materials provided by the fire dept., I created teaching notebooks and stuffed envelopes that were used as door-to-door teaching aids, focusing on the elderly, Spanish-speaking, and wood-frame homes with space heaters. Also senior citizens
132	I had 150 identification cards donated to me by a local police dept. And fingerprinted 100 elementary kids. On the ID card it had fingerprints, a photograph, and the height and weight of each child

133	I built a kiosk in Polk City it contains maps of the area, and brochures about the local area, lakes, etc
134	We labeled 197 Storm Drains in Boise, Idaho to warn people not to dump toxic waste into them. The contact agency for this project was the City Environmental Department
135	I placed reflective tape on the bonnets of the fire hydrants to make them more visible at night.
136	Organized 5 groups to mount 160 safety signs across Lake Allatoona, Georgia for the Allatoona Lake Association. Signs remind boaters of new law requiring children under 10 to wear P.F.D. while water craft is underway.
137	Made donation boxes, placed at several grocery stores over a month for customers to donate pet food/supplies; had all-day rally collecting food, money, cleaners and distributing educational material for the SPCA
138	The aim of my project was educate the public of the dangers associated with non-point water pollution. In order to do so, I stenciled an anti-dumping message onto storm drain inlets in my community. I also distributed a pamphlet that outlined the project
139	I gathered info on houses in my community then spray painted the address number on the front so that Emergency services could find them

140	This project includes the distribution of medicine vials and information sheet to provide emergency personnel with vital medical information
141	My project was a promotional video tape for the community center in our town. It gives a brief history of the center and also described the various services it provides to people. It is being showed at promotional functions to raise money for the center
142	Took a Ford Escort and disassembled it and carried the car piece by piece(except engine and transmission) into a Rehabilitation Center and reassembled it in the second floor gym for therapist to use to train people in wheelchairs the proper way to transfer from the chair to the car and vise-versa.
143	I recorded Books for blind children.
144	Made easels with dry erase boards on one side, cork boards on the other, for those who are handicapped. these were also wheelchair accessible
145	Printed a pamphlet on conserving energy in the home and distributed to 10,000 homes.
146	Constructed fifteen mechanical safety belt demonstrators for department of public safety.

147	Compiled listing of practical everyday ways average household can cut pollution and keep environment clean without elaborate or expensive preparation. Distributed to approximately 3,000 homes.
148	Made and posted warning signs and location markers on trail for hikers, dug irrigation ditches and laid rock and logs to route stagnant water off trail and into river, installed terracing steps made of flat boards and installed rope handrails to help ensure safety of hikers
149	Canvassed and recorded placement of smoke detectors in 20-block neighborhood, distributed literature demonstrating need, requirement for placement and need to maintain fresh batteries and reported results to fire department.
150	Designed, built and installed two map signs identifying ball diamonds and playing fields at sports complex.
151	Established system where young children were fingerprinted and photographed. Gave records to parents at no cost.
152	Taped Bible stories for the blind.
153	Surveyed all street signs and reported all missing or damaged signs.

154	Increased awareness of parents and parents-to-be of importance of reading to their' children and influence reading can have on their future success.
155	Built signs for interpretative trails telling history of area
156	Provided home yard safety training for children.
157	Researched information valuable to the elderly as well as local businesses who offer senior citizen discounts. Published and distributed a pamphlet with such information.
158	Arranged and catalogued many various corporate gifts in warehouse facility of Children's Museum.
159	Designed, produced and distributed 1,500 copies of brochure that boosted attendance at boys club.
160	Distributed window stickers to mark homes with young children and handicapped and senior citizens for emergency personnel.
161	Constructed hands-on exhibit on static electricity for children's museum.
162	Constructed study carrels at nonprofit adult literacy organization
163	Distributed water conservation pamphlets and installed 576 water-saving devices donated by a public utility.

164	Provided toys and books to Ronald McDonald House
165	I provided parents and children with information to prevent abductions. I also provided a place for parents to fingerprint and video tape their child in case they ever need to file a missing child report.
166	The number of bicycle thefts in our area was rising, so I worked with the Police to develop a card file where people could register their bikes. For three Saturdays we put on a bike safety and registration fair.
167	Hanging signs on trees or cementing them on the ground next to plants or shrubs identifying what they are.
168	Construct and install a Guide rope and Braille signs for a boardwalk at a local nature center. Nature centers always seem to have projects for Eagle Scouts.
169	Child Identification Project - called Kid-Pix. Fingerprinted and made photo I.D.'s
170	Community service for U.S. Bicentennial
171	Collected, repaired, painted and delivered toys to toy lending library and Salvation Army for distribution to needy children.

EAGLE PROJECTS REFERENCE BIRDS

172	Scout built 36 blue bird houses for the city parks department
173	Constructed a large (8' x 6' x 7') portable cage for the Bird Treatment & Learning Center
174	Scout supervised the building of Bluebird houses for park. These were used to replace houses destroyed during flooding in the park in 1999.
175	Scout worked on two bird refuges planting trees and weeding around habitat to allow grasses to grow for the birds.
176	Along the rail trail planed and installed split log benches. And build blue bird houses and installed them the project brought troop and the community together
177	Taking down and reconstructing corn crib to be used to house birds of prey at Nature Preserve
178	Worked with the Natural Resources Dept of the Town constructed and installed 75 bird houses in 13 locations in the town. Most houses were placed in known areas of mosquito pools for a more natural way to help control mosquitoes
179	Community Education of preservation of Blue Birds, Construction of Blue Bird houses with placement and maintenance.

180	constructed a storage shed to hold tools and bird feed, and improved the walkway for the handicapped at a nature park
181	Created a nature study area at Elementary School by planting 3 raised flower beds, 5 small bushes, 2 bird feeders, 2 bird houses, a bird bath, and bench
182	Built and installed 12 Blue Bird Houses at a Bird Sanctuary in my town. Hoping it will attract the Blue Birds back to this area
183	Rebuilt 3 ponds at a bird sanctuary and beautification of area
184	cut 25, 40 foot trees down on a tree farm and planted DEAD trees at a wetlands area for nesting platforms for birds of prey
185	Cut down trees and assembled them into floating nesting platforms 6 foot by 8 foot in a wetlands area for birds.
186	Built four benches for the local Speech, Hearing & Rehabilitation Center. He put up two bird feeders and a bird bath in the back yard of this facility in the memory of a family friend who used this center as an Alzheimer patient. 603	He created an outdoor garden area for a local battered women's shelter so the mom's might sit while watching their children at play.
604	Reorganizing and re-shelving the entire Library at the Cleveland Siegel College of Jewish Studies.
